Dear Association Members and Friends,

The Friends Meeting House of Randolph Township is the oldest place of worship in Morris County. It is owned by the Friends Meeting House and Cemetery Association of Randolph Township which is maintained by private funds.

The meeting house and cemetery have been undergoing extensive restoration. Basile Brothers, under the direction of Paul Basile, have encountered many problems, requiring additional funds, as the restoration work has progressed. Funds are running out, and the planned new heating system has yet to be installed. Below are sets of "before" and "after" pictures, detailing the type of work that has been completed thus far.

In February the Association sponsored a very successful public program that filled the meeting house and was widely covered by the news media from Boston through New Jersey. It consisted of an historical enactment of three anti-slavery advocates and members of the Mendham meeting, receiving the news of the passage of **"An Act for the Gradual Abolition of Slavery", February 15, 1804**. These three advocates, **Hartshorn FitzRandolph, Isaac Hance, and Henry Moore** were among the founders of the "New Jersey Society for Promoting the Abolition of Slavery" in 1776 and were instrumental in the passage of the 1804 legislation that helped bring an end to slavery in New Jersey.
