Dear Association Members and Friends.


The Friends Meeting House of Randolph Township is the oldest place of worship in Morris County and the oldest active Quaker Meeting House in northern New Jersey. It is owned by the Friends Meeting House and Cemetery Association of Randolph Township which is maintained by private funds.

Since 1984 the meeting house and cemetery have been undergoing extensive res-

toration. Basile Brothers, under the direction of Paul Basile, have completed ninety per cent of the work; however, they encountered many new problems, requiring additional funds, as the restoration work has progressed. Funds are running out, and the planned new heating system has yet to be installed. With this appeal we hope to raise sufficient funds to complete the current restoration projects and to install a new heating system.

WHERE THE FUNDS ARE NEEDED.




Shutter repair has been completed. As the window


frames have deteriorated badly, reinstallation of the shutters will cost between \$200 and \$300 per window.

The North and East sides of the Meeting House are in good condition and are being used to test for the best finishing technique. The estimated cost of a new heating system for the Meeting House is \$13,000.
